# **Community Priorities**

Each Quarter every SNT will send out a Contact Contract to the Parish Councils to allow each parish to highlight the top three issues which are affecting the Community. Once complete we can then focus our Policing towards these issues, taking into account the concerns raised, and who is best placed to tackle the issues with our Policing partners such as Wychavon and Malvern Hills Community safety team, trading standards, Worcester Regulatory Services etc. Working together as a collective allows the Police to engage with outside agencies and Parishes to have a joint approach to resolving the Community concerns. We are sending the contracts out in April.



### Meet the Evesham Team

Evesham SNT consists of Police Officers and Police Community Support Officers (PCSO). The team are based in Evesham Police Station, and work alongside the response teams. Below is a short snippet into the team members:-



PC Adam Johns Evesham Town 07811 761745

Adam has been with West Mercia Police for the last 7½ years. Previously Adam has worked on a busy response team, and has been with the Evesham SNT for the last 2 years. Adam covers Evesham Town, and has a wealth of knowledge in local policing.

When asked why he joined SNT he states "I am passionate about removing the drug issues with the town, this is an area which has a huge impact on the local businesses and residents, removing the offenders from the streets has a very positive impact for all". ## **Good News/Results**

The team have achieved some excellent results over the last few months, below are some of the highlights.

In March, SNT joined Warwickshire rural crime team to conduct a joint policing operation to recover stolen property from a location in Cleeve Prior. This resulted in nearly £160K of stolen property recovered and returned the owners, the suspect was identified and is currently under investigation for numerous offences.

We have conducted several joint operations with Worcestershire Trading Standards, and Worcester Regulatory Services to target the illegal tobacco and vape sales, together with patrols around areas targeted by rogue Traders. ### **SNT Week of action**

January saw the National week of action for Neighbourhood Policing teams across the Country. The week was launched by the National Police Chiefs' Council and the College of Policing to recognise and celebrate the vital work neighbourhood police officers, Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) and volunteer officers perform daily and nightly in their communities. The work focussed on:-

- early intervention
- problem-solving policing
- improving trust and confidence through neighbourhood policing
- wellbeing

Evesham SNT were very productive during the week, with visits to vulnerable victims, communuity events, stolen property recovered, speed enforcement etc.



Evesham Safer Neighbourhood Team have had a busy, but very productive week. With a great success in recovering a large number of stolen items, and arresting the suspect, to working with the SIA to conduct licensing checks at the local pubs and clubs, the team have also held drop in sessions for free tool and bike marking with Smartwater.

## Rural Crime

Rural crime has a huge impact on residents and businesses, so we prioritised our policing patrols in the more remote areas of our division. The below post highlights the success as we were in the right place at the right time, making three arrests when the suspects had targeted a rural business. We will again make the patrols a priority task as we enter the warmer months.

### Dwelling Burglary success story.

On 23<sup>rd</sup> March PC Adam JOHNS from our team had a fantastic result. The below post from our Twitter page highlights the amazing work. The suspect had stolen a very sentimental wedding ring belonging to the victims Mother, this was thankfully found and returned.

BURGLARY SUSPECT ARRESTED TODAY. Whilst on foot patrol one of our amazing SNT officers noticed a suspicious male in the riverside car-park, as he walked away a backpack was found in the area. The same male was detained a short time later and arrested for burglary. Everything fell into place perfectly, the victim had made a report of the burglary a very short time prior to this, the suspect was wearing a stolen coat, and had items on him which directly linked him to the burglary today. He remains in custody whilst the investigation is ongoing.



The victim took the time to post the following message on Facebook.

"The Police have managed to find the majority of my belongings and other items I never realised he had taken. The Police have done an amazing job, they are my heroes, brilliantly done".

## **Combatting County Lines Drug supply**

'County lines' is a term used to describe gangs and organised criminal networks involved in exporting illegal drugs into one or more importing areas within the UK, using dedicated mobile phone lines or other form of "deal line".

They are likely to exploit children and vulnerable adults to move and store the drugs and money and they will often use coercion, intimidation, violence (including sexual violence) and weapons.

Drug supply is a priority across West Mercia, and indeed the UK. We are focussed on reducing and removing the harm to the community, and we are always grateful for the intelligence the public report to the Police and via Crimestoppers. The criminal gangs will travel far and wide across the UK to expand their criminal activity.

SNT have targeted the areas where the received intelligence highlighted recent drug related activity. Having conducted patrols with the team in plain clothes we have achieved great success. The below highlights our recent work.

Drug supply is always going to be a concern, those who are involved in the drug related activity will target those who are most vulnerable in our society. There is an identified link in relation to drug supply and Child Exploitation where the most vulnerable are targeted by the County Lines gangs. The attached information poster highlights signs to spot for Children who are possibly being exploited.



More information for children and young people about county lines can be found by visiting Fearless <u>www.fearless.org/</u> Fearless is a site where you can access non-judgemental information and advice about crime and criminality. We have conducted a drugs warrant on the 9<sup>th</sup> April which was a success with a quantity of drugs seized, together with further items and drug paraphernalia in relation to drug supply.



During a week of targeted activity against the County Lines suspects, South Worcestershire Police has achieved some excellent results. Teams across the force were all involved in the activity, these included CID Proactive teams, dog unit, HQ road policing, response teams and Evesham SNT were also heavily involved. Our Divisions results:-15 Arrests Drugs seized valued at £90k Cash seized £1,810

Weapons and mobile phones seized, and one County Line closed down following the arrests.

### SNT Drop in surgeries

We hold regular Police drop in sessions in areas which have ongoing concerns and are linked to a higher increase in crime and ASB. We are looking to expand this into the more rural areas which will allow us to speak with the residents about local issues, and allow the sharing of information etc. This process would involve the Parish Council to allow a good working relationship between all agencies. ### Fraud prevention

We have recently started to hold drop in sessions to provide advice on fraud and how to protect you and your relatives. Fraud related cases across the UK are on the increase and can occur over the telephone or online. (Please see the attached advice sheets).

We have partnered with HSBC bank to meet residents face to face to discuss any concerns. The drop in sessions will take place inside HSBC, Evesham. Having already held the first session we will look to make this a regular event. Please keep an eye on our Neighbourhood Matters posts and social media pages for further details.



Don't part with any of your personal information, bank cards, money or valuables.

#### Remember criminals may be calling

Suspect anyone you don't know, regardless of who they claim to be. Some fraudster calls claim to be a police officer or bank official and states bank cards have been used fraudulently or they need assistance to investigate criminality within the bank.

They suggest the person hang up and ring the bank/police back to ensure the call is genuine. Don't be fooled - they stay on the line. They then ask for the bank card PIN to either be read out or keyed in.

#### Answer 'NO' to any personal questions

Don't part with any of your personal information or money. Remember, the police and your bank would NEVER ask for such details as your PIN or account numbers over the phone.



The drop in sessions will be further supported by our team at HQ who work within the Economic Crime Unit. The team are the experts in this type of offence, and we will work closely with them to ensure we offer the best and most up to date advice.

### Stay safe online

Someone else could gain access to your account and personal details. Don't forget to check and save purchase confirmation emails.

### Make sure wi-fi is secure

At home or other premises you know, make sure the wi-fi is secured before doing anything confidential online. When you're out and about, you can't guarantee it's secured even if you have to enter a code. When you're shopping, banking or making online payments, it's better to connect with 3G/4G/5G, even if it's slower.

### Beware of scam phone calls

If someone posing as a retailer calls you to confirm an online purchase, it could well be a scam. The idea is that you won't remember the purchase and call your bank. However, the fraudster stays on the line and tricks you into revealing your financial details. If this happens, hang up, don't call back, but report it to Action Fraud.

### **Check bank statements**

Check your bank and credit card accounts regularly for irregular or unauthorised transactions. If you spot any entries you don't recognise, contact your bank without delay. Make sure your bank has your up-to-date contact details so they can alert you if they spot anything unusual.

### Offenham dangerous dog incidents.

We have recently responded to a number of reports relating to a dog which was roaming freely around the Offenham area. The dog was reported to have attacked another dog. Following our enquiries we identified the owner(s) of the dog. Working with our Problem Solving Hub we have subsequently issued a Community Protection Notice warning with conditions to keep dogs under control. Our partners at Rooftop housing have taken further action and have issued a prohibition notice at the address which forbids any dogs to be kept at the house.

Community Protection Notices (CPNs) are intended to deal with particular, ongoing problems or nuisances which negatively affect the community's quality of life by targeting the person responsible, directing the individual, business or organisation responsible to stop causing the problem and, when appropriate, require the person responsible to take reasonable steps to ensure that it does not occur again. They can be issued to anyone aged 16 years or over, or to a body, e.g. an organisation, club, Company, etc. of any type.

Thank you to the residents who reported the dog to us, this allowed us to respond quickly to the location and achieve the positive outcome.

SmartWater is a clear liquid solution that carries a unique forensic code, and is even stronger and more accurate than DNA, it is virtually impossible to remove completely.

The solution glows yellow under ultra violet, with only a tiny speck needed to identify your unique code. This means that property can instantly be identified as stolen, so thieves won't touch it.







We are hosting a property marking event at The War Memorial in Broadway on Saturday 15th April between <u>0900 - 1300</u> hours.

By marking your property, you are helping to protect yourself and your property against thieves, and making it easier for your property to be identified and returned should it be stolen.

Please bring along any bikes, horse tack, power tools or household items that you would like to be marked. You will be able to ask us about crime prevention for your property whilst we mark your kit.
